

Day 2 starts off at Greystone Park and winds up in Douglastown. Starting time for the second day is 8:00 a.m.


A reception will be held at the Douglastown Community Centre, where trophies, participation medals and achievement awards will be presented.



One of the founding fathers of the cross country ski club, he is unable to ski because of the area the cancer is located.


A surprise birthday dinner was held at the Portage Restaurant. In attendance were family and friends and a sprinkle of government co-workers from yester-year's workplace.
